If you do not have internet access or a smart phone to view the Livestream Worship Service on Sunday mornings, you can now place a call through Zoom with your home phone and listen to the service. Please follow these directions to listen to our service over the phone:

- 1. Call 1 (929) 205-6099. You'll be greeted with a message that says, "Welcome to Zoom. Enter your Meeting ID, followed by #." Enter the meeting ID using your number pad on your phone: 813 9885 3819.
- 2. You will then receive the instructions, "Enter your Participant ID, followed by #. Otherwise, just press #." Enter the "#" using your number pad. Once you have successfully joined, your call will announce that you have joined the meeting. (If you are prompted to enter a passcode, please enter "4".)
- 3. Participants will be muted so that everyone can hear the service. You may hang up once the service is over.

Attention Graduating High School Seniors

If you are a graduating high school senior and a member of the church, you may apply for the Jack H. LaFever Memorial Achievement Award. Jack was a life-long member of First UMC who died in a car accident in 1986, at the age of 23. An applicant for this Award must be a church member. Selection is based on church and community service, scholastic achievement and extra curricular activities. You do not have to be considering post high school education to be eligible for the Award. Applications may be picked up from the church office or from Alex Konya (alexander.s.konya@lmco.com) and must be returned to the church office no later than April 30th, 2021.

Attention Post High School Students

Church members planning to enroll in college, vocational or technical school, or those who are currently enrolled, and need help with the cost of furthering their education should apply for an interest-free loan from the church's Educational Assistance Fund.
